I. INTRODUCTION

Shelby County Government (the “County”) is seeking proposals from qualified firms to supply 2015 Digital Color Oblique and Orthographic Aerial Imagery and Viewing Software to update existing Imagery over a County-wide coverage area of 873 square miles for the County (the “Services”). The delivered product will include 5-way oblique imagery (4 cardinal directions plus a Nadir (top down) orthographic view. Imagery shall be produced during “leaf off” conditions. This Request for Proposal (“RFP”) is being released to invite qualified firms to prepare and submit proposals in accordance with instructions provided where one or more successful candidate will be selected and invited to enter into a contractual relationship with Shelby County for the Services outlined in this RFP. In this RFP, the terms Proposer and Contractor are used interchangeably unless the context indicates otherwise.

II. MINIMUM PROPOSER REQUIREMENT

All Proposers must:

1. Have all appropriate licenses and certifications required to perform the Services in the State of Tennessee and provide copies of same.
2. Provide three (3) reference accounts for Services proposed with similar digital color oblique and orthographic photographic imagery and viewing software profile to the County, who the proposer has serviced in the last three (3) years for other counties of similar characteristics of Shelby County in the United States.
3. Demonstrate to the County’s satisfaction, prior to award, that it has the financial capability, resources, manpower, and equipment to perform the Services effectively.
4. Meet all requirements for the performance of the Services in accordance with the provisions of this RFP.
5. Apply and qualify for an Equal Opportunity Compliance (EOC) certification number thru our EOC Administration (see the details outlined in Section VII General Requirements i.e. Selection Criteria.).
6. Adhere to all Title VI requirements and provide proof/documentation if necessary.
7. A written statement of compliance to Title VI must be provided with your response.
8. Provide a performance bond in the amount of fifty (50%) percent of the amount of the Contract.
9. Independent contractors (sole proprietors) must adhere to State of Tennessee Public Chapter No.436, known as the “Tennessee Lawful Employment Act (effective date of 1/1/2012). Proof and documentation of employment eligibility must be included with the proposal.
10. Provide proof of the minimum insurance requirements (MANDATORY, please review closely.)

Please Note: *As a part of doing business with Shelby County, each individual, company, or organization is required to obtain an “Equal Opportunity Compliance” certification number prior to submitting your response.*

VI. PROPOSAL CONDITIONS

a. Contingencies

This RFP does not commit the County to award a contract. The County reserves the right to accept or reject any or all proposals if the County determines it is in the best interest of the County to do so. The County will notify all Proposers, in writing, if the County rejects all proposals.

b. Modifications

The County reserves the right to issue addenda or amendments to this RFP.

c. Proposal Submission

To be considered, all proposals must be submitted in the manner set forth in this RFP. It is the Proposer's responsibility to ensure that its proposals arrive on or before the specified time.

d. Incurred Costs

This RFP does not commit the County to pay any costs incurred in the preparation of a proposal in response to this RFP and Proposers agree that all costs incurred in developing this RFP are the Proposer's responsibility.

e. Final Authority

The final authority to award a contract rests solely with the Shelby County Purchasing Department.

f. Proposal Validity

Proposals submitted hereunder will be firm for at least ninety (90) calendar days from the due date unless otherwise qualified.

g. Disclosure of Proposal Contents

Provider understands and acknowledges that the County is a governmental entity subject to the laws of the State of Tennessee and that any reports, data, or other information supplied to the County is subject to being disclosed as a public record in accordance with the laws of the State of Tennessee. All proposals and other materials submitted become the property of Shelby County Government. All proposal information, including detailed price and cost information, will be held in confidence during the evaluation process and before the time of a Notice of Intent to Award is issued. Thereafter, proposals will become public information.

h. LOSB

The County encourages the utilization of locally owned small businesses as sources of subcontract work. The County notifies all respondents that all firms and/or individuals shall comply with the regulations relative to nondiscrimination in federally assisted programs of the Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended.

LOCALLY OWNED SMALL BUSINESS PURCHASING PROGRAM RULES AND REGULATIONS:

- (i) The Administrator of Purchasing in conjunction with the Administrator of EOC shall identify certain goods and services required by the County to be set aside for special purchasing procedures for locally owned small businesses.
- (ii) Only certified locally owned small businesses will be allowed to submit competitive bids on the goods or services identified under paragraph (i) above.
- (iii) The Administrator of Purchasing shall, in conjunction with the Administrator of EOC, annually review the Shelby County Capital Improvement Program to determine those projects with a construction cost of \$250,000 or more. Contracts amounting to at least ten (10%) of the construction costs of such project shall be awarded to locally owned small businesses as defined herein, except as set forth in sub-paragraph (vi) of this section, either as part of the conditions of the solicitation for general contractors bidding on these projects, or as separate bids issued by the County for subcontracts that may be assigned to general contractors.
- (iv) After adhering to all other bidding and purchasing requirements of the County, not inconsistent with this part, if no bids are received from locally owned small businesses, then the County may solicit bids for the goods or services from all other sources.

- (v) On all purchases and/or contracts entered into by the County, the Purchasing Administrator or his or her designee shall have the right to negotiate with any supplier of goods or services to the County for the inclusion of locally owned small business subcontractors and/or suppliers in the contract award.
- (vi) Failure by a supplier or contractor to include locally owned small business sub-contractors or suppliers in its bid or contract may be grounds for rejection of said bid or contract unless the supplier or contractor can show documented evidence of good cause why none were included.
- (vii) Any locally owned small business awarded a contract or purchase order under this section shall not sublet, subcontract, or assign any work or services awarded to it without the prior written consent of the Mayor or the Purchasing Administrator.
- (viii) As to those purchases below the requirement for a formal bid solicitation (currently, under \$15,000) and not included in the locally owned small business set aside, the Administrator of Purchasing shall determine if any locally owned small business offers that product or service. If so, at least one such eligible locally owned small business should be included in the vendors contacted for an opportunity to bid, and the Administrator of Purchasing may, at his discretion, designate in a purchase order the purchase of such goods and services from the identified locally owned small business.
- (ix) In those situations where a locally owned small business as defined herein, engages in open competitive bidding for County contracts, the Administrator of Purchasing shall provide for a preference for the locally owned small business where responsibility and quality are equal. Said preferences shall not exceed five percent (5%) of the lowest possible bidder meeting specifications. The preference shall be applied on a sliding scale in the following manner:
 - a. A preference of up to five percent (5%) shall be allowed for contracts up to \$500,000.00;
 - b. A preference of up to three and five-tenths percent (3.5%) shall be allowed for contracts up to \$750,000.00;
 - c. A preference of two and one-half percent (2.5%) shall be allowed for contracts up to \$1,000,000.00;
 - c. A preference of two percent (2%) shall be allowed for contracts that exceed \$1,000,000.00.
 - d. For construction contracts over \$2,000,000.00, the Administrator of Purchasing shall provide for a preference of two percent (2%) to general contractors meeting the requirements of Section 1, Subparagraph B, if fifty percent (50%) or more of the total work comprising the bid has been or will be awarded to certified locally owned small businesses. The fifty percent subcontracting threshold must be met prior to contract execution.
- (xi) The Administrator of Purchasing may divide a single bid package for any purchase of goods and services into two or more smaller bid packages in any case that the Administrator of Purchasing reasonably believes that the smaller bid packages will result in a greater number of bids by locally owned small businesses.

- (xii) The Administrator of Purchasing, upon approval of the County Mayor, may establish special insurance and bonding requirements for certified locally owned small businesses so long as they are not in conflict with the laws of the State of Tennessee.
- (xiii) The Administrator of Purchasing, with the approval of the County Mayor, shall adopt and promulgate, and may from time to time, amend rules and regulations not inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance, governing the purchase of goods and services from locally owned small business concerns to effectuate and implement the Locally Owned Small Business Purchasing Program within the intent of this ordinance.
- (xiv) The Administrator of EOC shall, in conjunction with the Administrator of Purchasing, provide a written quarterly report to the Mayor and Board of Commissioners which shall include a summary of the purchases selected for this program, a listing of the contracts awarded to locally owned small businesses for the period, and the dollar amounts of each such contract, and the percentage which such contracts bear to the total amount of purchases for the period.

i. Non-Discrimination and Title VI

The contractor hereby agrees, warrants, and assures compliance with the provisions of Title VI and VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and all other federal statutory laws which provide in whole or in part that no person shall be excluded from participation or be denied benefits of or be otherwise subjected to discrimination in the performance of this Contract or in the employment practices of the contractor on the grounds of handicap and/or disability, age, race, color, religion, sex, national origin, or any other classification protected by federal, Tennessee State Constitutional or statutory law. The contractor shall upon request show proof of such non-discrimination and shall post in conspicuous places available to all employees and applicants notices of non-discrimination.

Any recipient entity shall be subject to the requirements of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 42 U.S.C. 2000d et seq., and regulations promulgated pursuant thereto. It shall develop a Title VI implementation plan with participation by protected beneficiaries as may be required by such law or regulations. To the extent applicable, such plan shall include Title VI implementation plans sub recipients of federal funds through the entity. The contractor shall produce the plan upon request of Shelby County Government. Failure to provide same shall constitute a material breach of contract.

VII. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

A. Background

Shelby County Government is soliciting written proposals on a competitive basis from qualified service providers to provide digital color oblique and orthographic photographic imagery and viewing software to update existing imagery over a County-wide area of 873 square miles. The delivered product will include 5-way oblique imagery (4 cardinal directions plus a Nadir (top down) orthographic view. Imagery shall be produced during “leaf off” conditions.

B. Scope of Contract

The County wishes to engage in a contractual relationship with the best-qualified provider selected through a competitive process that will work well with the County in the performance of the Services in a manner that is cost-effective and practical. The provider must be prepared to begin immediately upon receipt of a Notice to Proceed.

C. Project Time Frame

The initial contract term will be for two fiscal years (FY2015 and FY2016). Payments will be made within 30 days after Shelby County reviews the data. The second payment will be made on the first year anniversary. Contract will have the option to renew for three additional biannual flights.

D. Reservation of Rights

The County reserves the right, for any reason to accept or reject any one or more proposals, to negotiate the term and specifications for the services provided, to modify any part of the RFP, or to issue a new RFP.

The County may at any reasonable time, at its expense, make an audit of the Contractor’s books relative to the Accounts.

E. Selection Criteria

Each response will be evaluated on the criteria outlined in Section XII of this document. Each bidder should set out in it’s response to this RFP to clearly identify the qualifications of its company and each individual who will work on this project.

F. Additional Information and References

Proposers must include a list of three (3) reference accounts with similar digital color oblique and orthographic imagery and viewing software profile to the County who the proposer has serviced within the last three (3) years. Any additional information that would be helpful to the County in evaluating a proposal should be provided.

While it is mandatory that the proposer provide the information the format presented in this document any alternative approaches presented as additional information will be considered and welcomed.

VIII. AWARD OF CONTRACT

Proposers are advised that the lowest cost proposal will not necessarily be awarded the contract, as the selection will be based upon qualification criteria as deemed by the County and as determined by the selection committee and the County Mayor.

IX. PURPOSE

Shelby County Government is soliciting written proposals, from qualified companies to provide 2015 Oblique and Orthographic Aerial Imagery to ReGIS. Proposers respond to section A (below).

A. 2015 Oblique and Orthographic Aerial Imagery Requirements.

1. “Attachment 1 – Proposal Response Sheet” - must be used to submit all pertinent information requested.
2. “Attachment 2 – Proposal Price Sheet” - Pricing must be submitted by product deliverable. (All pricing shall be included in a separate sealed envelope.)
3. The deliverable product shall include:
 - a. Imagery covering the entire Shelby County Tennessee political area plus a 1 mile ‘buffer’ area of the surrounding counties at ‘5-way’ (oblique) 4 inch Ground Sample Distance (hereinafter GSD)
 - b. Digital mosaics at the same 4 inch GSD resolution, and uncompressed TIF format imagery
 - c. An area wide mosaic Digital Elevation Model (DEM) in a suitable format.
 - d. Deliverables shall include TIFF image files and mosaic tiles composed in SID format.

- e. Delivered product shall include 5 (five) copies of all media and vendor-provided software on portable hard drives equipped with USB 2.0 and 3.0.
 - f. The selected vendor must provide a software package and technical support for the length of the contract which allows Shelby County to utilize their existing investment in oblique and ortho imagery (provided by Pictometry, Intl.) along with the future deliverable imagery suite flown in 2015.
 - g. The vendor will provide an enterprise desktop as well as full suite of ‘cloud based’ solutions to access both collected imagery and integration with current or planned GIS-based data. The vendor will therefore provide proof of system integration with ESRI products including but not limited to the current version of desktop ESRI applications and server-based ESRI software tools , and a definitive plan for providing County-wide password-protected client-based access to the web-based product(s)
 - h. The vendor must provide onsite training as part of the contract deliverables
4. The successful vendor’s oblique imagery must prove integration with the Tyler CAMA system currently in use at the Shelby County Assessor’s Office as well as integration with iasWorld software.
 5. The selected vendor must prove system integration with the 911 Computer Aided Dispatch software programs currently in use throughout Shelby County including but not limited to TriTech and Motorola technologies.
 6. In order to support existing and planned mutual aid efforts for Disaster Recovery, the successful vendor must be able to integrate the surrounding counties’ oblique imagery (if available) into the County’s software package with the intent of providing an area-wide coverage in the operational response to a disaster, Category 4 or greater tornado activity, or emergency encompassing a large area. This imagery is used to assist planning, assessment, emergency management, law enforcement, recovery and others.
 7. The vendor shall guarantee a county-wide delivery within 60 calendar days from the completion of data capture, and provide for a minimum of 30 days for product review by the County. The successful vendor must be the sole provider for the ortho and oblique imagery, with a clear chain of ownership and responsibility for any discrepancies or errors discovered in the data during the 30 day review period.
 8. All proposed vendor employees granted access to County resources comply with relevant County PCI, HIPAA and Network policies and procedures. ReGIS will provide any other relevant policies as required or upon request of the vendor.
 9. Vendor support personnel responding on-site must have the necessary training and command the knowledge to independently repair and successfully operate the vendor software.
 10. The Successful Bidder must provide either a toll-free phone number or a phone number located within the local calling area for Memphis, TN for service calls.
 11. The Successful Bidder must provide any tools and software they deem necessary for diagnosing system issues, and must assume responsibility for appropriate licensing and usage of the tools and software.

X. CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS

The successful Proposer will be expected to enter into a contract incorporating the following terms and conditions, and such additional terms and conditions standard to services of this type.

A. General Requirements

1. Control. All services by the Contractor will be performed in a manner satisfactory to the County, and in accordance with the generally accepted business practices and procedures of the County.
2. Contractor's Personnel. The Contractor certifies that it presently has adequate qualified personnel to perform all services required under this Contract. All work under this Contract will be supervised by the contractor. The Contractor further certifies that all of its employees assigned to serve the County have such knowledge and experience as required to perform the duties assigned to them. Any employee of the Consultant who, in the opinion of the County, is incompetent, or whose conduct becomes detrimental to the work, shall immediately be removed from association with services under this Contract.
3. Independent Status.
 - (a) Nothing in this Contract shall be deemed to represent that the contractor, or any of the contractor's employees or agents, are the agents, representatives, or employees of the County. The Contractor will be an independent consultant over the details and means for performing its obligations under this Contract. Anything in this Contract which may appear to give County the right to direct the Contractor as to the details of the performance of its obligations under this Contract or to exercise a measure of control over the Contractor is solely for purposes of compliance with local, state and federal regulations and means that the Consultant will follow the desires of the County only as to the intended results of the scope of this Contract.
 - (b) It is further expressly agreed and understood by Contractor that neither it nor its employees or agents are entitled to any benefits which normally accrue to employees of the County; that the contractor has been retained by the County to perform the services specified herein (not hired) and that the remuneration specified herein is considered fees for services performed (not wages) and that invoices submitted to the County by the Contractor for services performed shall be on the Consultant's letterhead.
4. Termination or Abandonment.
 - (a) It shall be cause for the immediate termination of this Contract if, after its execution, the County determines that either:
 - i. The Contractor or any of its principals, partners or corporate officers, if a corporation, including the corporation itself, has plead nolo contendere, or has plead or been found guilty of a criminal violation, whether state or federal, involving, but not limited to, governmental sales or purchases, including but not limited to the rigging of bids, price fixing, or any other collusive and illegal activity pertaining to bidding and governmental contracting.
 - ii. The Contractor has subcontracted, assigned, delegated, or transferred its rights, obligations or interests under this Contract without the County's consent or approval.
 - iii. The Contractor has filed bankruptcy, become insolvent or made an assignment for the benefit of creditors, or a receiver, or similar officer is appointed to take charge of all or part of Contractor's assets.
 - (b) The County may terminate the Contract upon five (5) days written notice by the County or its authorized agent to the Contractor for Contractor's failure to provide the services specified under this Contract.
 - (c) This Contract may be terminated by either party by giving thirty (30) days written notice to the other, before the effective date of termination. In the event of such termination, the Contractor shall be entitled to receive just and equitable compensation for any satisfactory work performed as of the termination date; however, the Contractor shall not be reimbursed for any anticipatory profits that have not been earned as of the date of termination.

- (d) All work accomplished by Contractor prior to the date of such termination shall be recorded and tangible work documents shall be transferred to and become the sole property of the County prior to payment for services rendered.
 - (e) Notwithstanding the above, the Contractor shall not be relieved of liability to the County for damages sustained by the County by virtue of any breach of the Contract by the Contractor and the County may withhold any payments to Consultant for the purpose of setoff until such time as the exact amount of damages due the County from the Contractor is determined.
5. Subcontracting, Assignment or Transfer. Any subcontracting, assignment, delegation or transfer of all or part of the rights, responsibilities, or interest of either party to this Contract is prohibited unless by written consent of the other party. No subcontracting, assignment, delegation, or transfer shall relieve the Contractor from performance of its duties under this contract. The County shall not be responsible for the fulfillment of the Contractor's obligations to its transferors or sub-contractors. Upon the request of the other party, the subcontracting, assigning, delegating, or transferring party shall provide all documents evidencing the assignment.
6. Conflict Of Interest. The Contractor covenants that it has no public or private interest, and will not acquire directly or indirectly any interest, which would conflict in any manner with the performance of its services. The Contractor warrants that no part of the total contract amount provided herein shall be paid directly or indirectly to any officer or employee of the County as wages, compensation, or gifts in exchange for acting as officer, agent, employee, sub-contractor to the Contractor in connection with any work contemplated or performed relative to this Contract.
7. Covenant against Contingent Fees. The Contractor warrants that it has not employed or retained any company or person other than a bona fide employee working solely for the Contractor, to solicit or secure this Contract, and that it has not paid or agreed to pay any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for the Contractor any fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gift, or any other consideration contingent upon or resulting from the award or making of this Contract. For breach or violation of this warranty, the County will have the right to recover the full amount of such fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gift, or other consideration.
8. Employment of County Workers.
- (a) The Contractor will not engage, on a full or part-time, or other basis during the period of the Contract, any professional or technical personnel who are in the current employment of the County.
 - (b) Notwithstanding the foregoing, no prior County official or employee may be employed by or receive compensation, wages or benefits from the Contractor for a period of one year from employment separation from the County if during the period or employment with the County the employee or official had any direct or indirect involvement with the Contractor's services or operations provided to the County.
9. Arbitration. Any dispute concerning a question of fact in connection with the work not disposed of by agreement between the Consultant and the County will be referred to the Shelby County Contract Administrator or his/her duly authorized representative, whose decision regarding same will be final.
10. General Compliance with Laws.
- (a) If required, the Contractor shall certify that it is qualified and duly licensed to do business in the State of Tennessee and that it will take such action as, from time to time, may be necessary to remain so qualified and it shall obtain, at its expense, all licenses, permits, insurance, and governmental approvals, if any, necessary to the performance of its obligations under this Contract.
 - (b) The Contractor is assumed to be familiar with and agrees that at all times it will observe and comply with all federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, and regulations in any manner affecting the conduct of the work. The preceding shall include, but is not limited to, compliance with all Equal Employment Opportunity laws, the Fair Labor Standards Act, Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) requirements, the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), and all state and local laws, rules and regulations pertaining to electrical requirements of residential construction and renovation.
 - (c) This Contract will be interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Tennessee. By execution of this

contract the Contractor agrees that all actions, whether sounding in contract or in tort, relating to the validity, construction, interpretation and enforcement of this contract will be instituted and litigated in the courts of the State of Tennessee, located in Shelby County, Tennessee, and in no other. In accordance herewith, the parties to this contract submit to the jurisdiction of the courts of the State of Tennessee located in Shelby County, Tennessee.

11. Nondiscrimination. The Contractor hereby agrees, warrants, and assures that no person shall be excluded from participation in, be denied benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination in the performance of this Contract or in the employment practices of the Contractor on the grounds of handicap and/or disability, age, race, color, religion, sex, national origin, or any other classification protected by Federal, Tennessee State constitutional, or statutory law. The Contractor shall upon request show proof of such nondiscrimination, and shall post in conspicuous places available to all employees and applicants notices of nondiscrimination.

12. Entire Agreement. This Contract contains the entire Contract of the parties and there are no other promises or conditions in any other Contract whether oral or written. This Contract supersedes any prior written or oral Contracts between the parties.

13. Amendment. This Contract may be modified or amended, only if the amendment is made in writing and is signed by both parties.

14. Severability. If any provision of this Contract is held to be unlawful, invalid or unenforceable under any present or future laws, such provision shall be fully severable; and this Contract shall then be construed and enforced as if such unlawful, invalid or unenforceable provision had not been a part hereof. The remaining provisions of this Contract shall remain in full force and effect and shall not be affected by such unlawful, invalid, or unenforceable provision or by its severance here from. Furthermore, in lieu of such unlawful, invalid, or unenforceable provision, there shall be added automatically as a part of this Contract a provision as similar in terms to such unlawful, invalid, or unenforceable provision as may be possible, and be legal, valid, and enforceable.

15. No Waiver of Contractual Right. No waiver of any term, condition, default, or breach of this Contract, or of any document executed pursuant hereto, shall be effective unless in writing and executed by the party making such waiver; and no such waiver shall operate as a waiver of either (a) such term, condition, default, or breach on any other occasion or (b) any other term, condition, default, or breach of this Contract or of such document. No delay or failure to enforce any provision in this Contract or in any document executed pursuant hereto shall operate as a waiver of such provision or any other provision herein or in any document related hereto. The enforcement by any party of any right or remedy it may have under this Contract or applicable law shall not be deemed an election of remedies or otherwise prevent such party from enforcement of one or more other remedies at any time.

16. Matters To Be Disregarded. The titles of the several sections, subsections, and paragraphs set forth in this contract are inserted for convenience of reference only and shall be disregarded in construing or interpreting any of the provisions of this contract.

17. Subject To Funding. This Contract is subject to annual appropriations of funds by the Shelby County Government. In the event sufficient funds for this Contract are not appropriated by Shelby County Government for any of its fiscal period during the term hereof, then this Contract will be terminated. In the event of such termination, the consultant shall be entitled to receive just and equitable compensation for any satisfactory work performed as of the termination date.

18. Travel Expenses. All travel expenses payable under this Contract shall be in accordance with the County Travel Policy and Procedures. This includes advance written travel authorization, submission of travel claims, documentation requirements, and reimbursement rates. The County will make no travel advances.

19. Incorporation of Other Documents.

(a) Contractor shall provide services pursuant to this Contract in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth within the

Shelby County Request for the Shelby County Purchasing Department and incorporated herein by reference.

- (b) It is understood and agreed between the parties that in the event of a variance between the terms and conditions of this Contract and any amendment thereto and the terms and conditions contained either within the Request for Proposals/Bids or the Response thereto, the terms and conditions of this Contract as well as any amendment shall take precedence and control the relationship and understanding of the parties.

20. Contracting With Locally Owned Small Businesses. The Contractor shall take affirmative action to utilize Locally Owned Small Businesses when possible as sources of supplies, equipment, construction and services.

21. Incorporation Of Whereas Clauses. The foregoing whereas clauses are hereby incorporated into this Contract and made a part hereof.

22. Waiver of Proprietary Interest. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein or within any other document supplied to County by the Contractor, Contractor understands and acknowledges that County is a governmental entity subject to the laws of the State of Tennessee and that any reports, data or other information supplied to County by Consultant due to services performed pursuant to this Contract is subject to being disclosed as a public record in accordance with the laws of the State of Tennessee.

23. Organization Status and Authority.

- (a) Contractor represents and warrants that it is a corporation, limited liability company, partnership, or other entity duly organized, validly existing and in good standing under the laws of the state of Tennessee; it has the power and authority to own its properties and assets and is duly qualified to carry on its business in every jurisdiction wherein such qualification is necessary.
- (b) The execution, delivery and performance of this Contract by the Contractor has been duly authorized by all requisite action and will not violate any provision of law, any order of any court or other agency of government, the organizational documents of the Contractor, any provision of any indenture, agreement or other instrument to which the Contractor is a party, or by which the Contractor's respective properties or assets are bound, or be in conflict with, result in a breach of, or constitute (with due notice or lapse of time or both) a default under any such indenture, agreement or other instrument, or result in the creation or imposition of any lien, charge or encumbrance of any nature whatsoever upon any of the properties or assets.

24. Warranty. The Contractor warrants to the County that all Services shall be performed in accordance with acceptable standards in the industry applicable to the Services. The Contractor shall correct, at its sole cost and expense, any work reasonably deemed to be unsatisfactory by the County. The Contractor warrants to the County that all Services shall be in strict compliance with the terms of this Contract, and all applicable governmental laws, rules and regulations.

25. Rights in Data. The County shall become the owner, and the Contractor shall be required to grant to the County, or its successors, a perpetual, non-exclusive, non-transferable, royalty-free right, in the County's name, to use any deliverables provided by the Contractor under this Contract, regardless of whether they are proprietary to the Contractor or to any third parties.

A. INDEMNIFICATION AND INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

1. Responsibilities for Claims and Liabilities.

- (a) Contractor shall indemnify, defend, save and hold harmless the County, and its elected officials, officers, employees, agents, assigns, and instrumentalities from and against any and all claims, liability, losses or damages—including but not limited to Title VII and 42 USC 1983 prohibited acts—arising out of or resulting from any conduct; whether actions or omissions; whether intentional, unintentional, or negligent; whether legal or illegal; or otherwise that occur in connection with or in breach of this Contract or in the performance of the duties hereunder, whether performed by the
- (b) Contractor its sub-contractors, agents, employees or assigns. This indemnification shall survive the termination or conclusion of this Contract.

- (c) The Contractor expressly understands and agrees that any insurance protection required by this Contract or otherwise provided by the Contractor shall in no way limit the responsibility to indemnify, defend, save and hold harmless the County or its elected officials, officers, employees, agents, assigns, and instrumentalities as herein provided.
- (d) The County has no obligation to provide legal counsel or defense to the Contractor or its sub-contractors in the event that a suit, claim, or action of any character is brought by any person not party to this Contract against the Contractor as a result of or relating to obligations under this Contract.
- (e) Except as expressly provided herein, the County has no obligation for the payment of any judgment or the settlement of any claims against the Contractor as a result of or relating to obligations under this Contract.
- (f) The Contractor shall immediately notify the County, c/o Shelby County Government, Contracts Administration, 160 N. Main Street, Suite 900, Memphis, TN 38103, of any claim or suit made or filed against the Contractor or its sub-contractors regarding any matter resulting from or relating to Consultant's obligations under this Contract and will cooperate, assist and consult with the County in the defense or investigation thereof.

2. Insurance Requirements. The Contractor will provide evidence of the following Insurance coverage:

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES/CONSULTANT PROJECTS LESS THAN \$1,000,000

Minimum Limits of Insurance

Contractor/provider shall maintain coverage with limits of no less than:

Shelby County Government, its elected officials, appointees, employees and members of boards, agencies, and commissions shall be named as additional insured. The insurance shall include coverage for the following:

 - b) Products/Completed Operations
 - c) Contractual
 - d) Independent Contractors
 - e) Broad Form Property Damage
 - f) Personal Injury and Advertising Liability
 - g) Cyber Liability-minimum limit \$500,000
- 2) *Business Automobile Liability Insurance* – minimum limit of \$1,000,000 each accident for property damage and bodily injury. Coverage is to be provided on all:
 - a) Owned/Leased Autos
 - b) Non-owned Autos
 - c) Hired Autos
- 3) *Workers Compensation and Employers' Liability Insurance* – Including coverage sole proprietors, partners, and officers, regardless of requirement by Tennessee State Statute. Policy is to be specifically endorsed to include these individuals for coverage. Employers Liability Coverage is \$1,000,000 per accident. The Workers' Compensation policy shall include form WC 00 03 13, or its equivalent, waiving subrogation rights against Shelby County, its elected officials, appointees, and employees.
- 4) *Professional Liability/Errors & Omissions Insurance* – minimum of \$1,000,000 per claim or occurrence/\$3,000,000 annual aggregate. Indicate if coverage is on occurrence basis or claims-made basis.
- 5) *A performance bond* in the amount of 50% of the amount of the contract is required from the successful contractor.

- 6) *Aviation Liability* - minimum of \$5,000,000 liability limit per claim or occurrence. Pilot to have a commercial pilot's certificate with a minimum of 1,000 hours total time and 100 hours in the specific make and model to be used in project. Shelby County Government, its elected officials, appointees, employees and members of boards, agencies, and commissions shall be named as additional insureds

Upon termination or cancellation of any claims-made coverage currently in effect under this agreement, the contractor shall purchase an extended reporting endorsement and furnish evidence of same to the _____ county.

All policies will provide for thirty (30) days written notice to Shelby County of cancellation of coverage provided. Ten (10) days notice is applicable to non-payment of premium. If the insurer is not required by the policy terms and conditions to provide written notice of cancellation to Shelby County, the Provider will provide immediate notice to Shelby County and evidence of replacement coverage with no lapse.

All insurance policies maintained by the Provider shall provide that insurance as applying to Shelby County shall be primary and non-contributing irrespective of such insurance or self-insurance as Shelby County may maintain in its own name and on its own behalf.

Any insurance company of the Provider shall be admitted and authorized to do business in the State of Tennessee and shall carry a minimum rating assigned by A.M. Best & Company's Key Rating Guide of "A-" and a Financial Size Category of "X".

B. Right to Monitor and Audit

Access to Records. During all phases of the work and services to be provided hereunder the Contractor agrees to permit duly authorized agents and employees of the County, to enter the Contractor's offices for the purpose of inspections, reviews and audits during normal working hours. Reviews may also be accomplished at meetings that are arranged at mutually agreeable times and places. The Contractor will maintain all books, documents, papers, accounting records, and other evidence pertaining to the fee paid under this Contract and make such materials available at their offices at all reasonable times during the period of this Contract and for three (3) years from the date of payment under this Contract for inspection by the County or by any other governmental entity or agency participating in the funding of this Contract, or any authorized agents thereof; copies of said records to be furnished if requested.

XI. PROPOSAL SUBMISSION

A. GENERAL

1. All interested and qualified Proposers are invited to submit a proposal for consideration. Submission of a proposal indicates that the Proposer has read and understands this entire RFP, including all attachments, exhibits, schedules, and addenda (as applicable) and all concerns regarding this RFP have been satisfied.
2. Proposals must be submitted in the format described below. Proposals are to be prepared in such a way as to provide a straightforward, concise description of capabilities to satisfy the requirements of this RFP. Expensive bindings, colored displays, promotional materials, etc. are neither necessary nor desired. Emphasis should be concentrated on conformance to the RFP instructions, responsiveness to the RFP requirements, and on completeness and clarity of content.
3. Proposals must be complete in all respects as required in this section. A proposal may not be considered if it is conditional or incomplete.
4. All copies of proposals must be received by **no later than 4:00 pm (CST) on Friday, December 5, 2014,**

5. Proposer agrees to provide the County with any additional information it deems necessary to accurately determine their ability to perform the services proposed. Furthermore, submission of this proposal constitutes permission by this organization for the County to verify all information contained in the proposal. Failure to comply with any request for additional information may disqualify this organization from further consideration. Such additional information may include evidence of financial ability to perform.

B. PROPOSAL PRESENTATION

3. **ALL PRICING WILL BE PROVIDED IN SEPARATE SEALED ENVELOPES.**
4. Proposals must be in ink. Erasures and "white-out" are not permitted. Mistakes may be crossed out, corrections typed adjacent and initialed in ink by the person signing the proposal. Please identify all attachments, literature and samples, etc., with your firm name and our bid number.
5. Proposals must be verified before submission as they cannot be withdrawn or corrected after being opened. The County will not be responsible for errors or omissions on the part of bidders in making up their proposals. A responsible officer or employee must sign proposals. Tennessee sales tax shall not be included in the Consultant's proposal.

XII. PROPOSAL EVALUATION AND SELECTION

1. Initial Review

- b. Proposers must meet the Minimum Proposer Requirements outlined in Section II of this RFP.

2. Technical Review

Proposals meeting the above requirements will be evaluated based on the following criteria:

- a. Each proposal will be reviewed by a special Committee, appointed by the ReGIS department, which may elect to schedule a personal presentation and interview with one or more of the proposers. After the review process is completed, this committee will recommend the successful proposer to the Purchasing

Administrator, who makes the decision, subject to the approval of the contract by the Mayor.

- b. The committee will assess the proposals for this project. Based on the scores, comments, and recommendations of the committee members, the committee will select a short list of firms for interviews. Evaluation criteria to include:

- i. Understanding of the Services required by the County;
- ii. Quality and responsiveness of the proposal;
- iii. Quality and availability of staff assigned to the project;
- iv. Background and related experience of the individuals assigned to this project;
- v. Recent experience on similar projects
- vi. Proposed cost to the County

Once the technical proposal is discussed and ranked, the cost proposal will be reviewed for consistency with, and in light of, the evaluation of the technical proposal. The selection committee reserves the right to seek clarification of any proposal submitted and to select the proposal considered to best promote the public interest. The selection committee will submit the results in order of preference to Purchasing for final acceptance.

3. Oral Presentation

Shelby County Government reserves the right to interview, or require an oral presentation from, any respondent for clarification of information set forth in the Proposer's response. In this regard, at the discretion of the evaluation committee, some or all Proposers who submit a Proposal in response to this RFP may be asked to submit to an interview or give an oral presentation of their respective Proposals to the evaluation committee. If so, this is not to be a presentation restating the Proposal, but rather an in-depth analysis of certain qualifications of the Proposer. The interview or oral presentation, if utilized, is intended to provide an opportunity for the Proposer to clarify or elaborate on its qualifications without restating the Proposal. The interview or oral presentation is to be a fact finding and explanation session only and is not to be used to negotiate any terms of contract. If required, the time and location of such interview or oral presentation will be scheduled by the Administrator of Purchasing. Interviews and oral presentations are strictly an option of the Shelby County Government or its evaluation committee and, consequently, may or may not be conducted. All travel expenses to and from the interview or oral presentation shall be the responsibility of the Proposer. Selection will be based on determination of which proposal best meets the needs of the County and the requirements of this RFP.

Shelby County Government reserves the right to consider the vendor's EOC rating in all evaluations.

B. CONTRACT AWARD

Contract(s) will be awarded based on a competitive selection of proposals received. Proposers are advised that the lowest cost proposal will not necessarily be awarded the Contract, as the selection will be based upon qualification criteria as deemed by the County and as determined by the selection committee and the County Mayor. The proposals submitted will be evaluated by the County. All decisions are made at the discretion of the County.

The contents of the proposal of the successful Proposer will become contractual obligations and failure to accept these obligations in a contractual agreement may result in cancellation of the award.

The County reserves the right to negotiate any portions of the successful Proposer's fees and scope of work or utilize their own resources for such work.
